8. expostulate	(v.) To attempt to dissuade someone from some course or decision by earnest reasoning
9. flogged	beaten severely with a whip or rod
10. frivolous	(adj.) of little importance, not worthy of serious attention; not meant seriously
11. heathenism	"religion" of those who don't believe in God and/or are uncivilized
12. lament	To express sorrow or regret; to mourn
13. magistrate	A civil public officer invested with the powers and functions, which may be judicial, executive, or legislative in nature; a Justice of the Peace is a magistrate
